I get to work with data starting with the data submission guidelines all the way through the process to publishing findings. Some projects that I work on include measuring the state's total health care

spending and comparing growth rates to state cost containment benchmarks and measuring spending for primary care and behavioral health services.

However, so far I've found a lot of fulfillment in public sector work and being in a job I find enjoyable and challenging while also feeling like I'm playing a part in contributing to a greater good.
